Mailbox Topper Project 2021 – Dates and Reminders: Tanya Copeland, Chair Bring Evergreens. Evergreens that work well: Juniper, Hemlock, Nandina, Danae, Magnolia, Pine, Boxwood, Yew, etc.

Decorative Elements: Wired pinecones, Dried Hydrangea, Holly Berry clumps, Nandina berries, etc.

Cut your branches into 16"-18" lengths

Strip the first 4" at the base of your greenery – this allows room for fastening with zip ties

Bundle greenery with twine or rubber bands – these steps make it a fun and productive assembly day.

If your materials are prepped and ready to go, just bring them with you on Assembly Day. It not.....**Greenery Drop Off Days: Friday 11/26 – Monday 11/29** If you won't be able to fully prep your greenery before Tuesday, please drop your branches in the water buckets at the Copeland's driveway so we will have time to get the materials ready for assembly.
